

## **TEC, ICAR- IVRI Pune, organised an animal health camp on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2017 at *Hargude* village, Pune District**

Training and Education Centre, ICAR – Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Pune in collaboration with KNP College of Veterinary Sciences (MAFSU), Shirwal, Satara and Department of Animal Husbandry, Government of Maharashtra, organised an animal health camp on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2017 at *Hargude* village of Purandar taluka in Pune district.

During the camp, a total of 225 animals consisting of 183 cattle, 12 buffaloes and 30 goats of 60 farmers were treated. Most of the animals were crossbred cattle, besides buffaloes and goats; among them 18 were young and 207 were adult animals. Different types of cases recorded were endo-parasitic infection (115), ecto-parasitic infection (40), anorexia (10), debility (24), enteritis (14), anoestrus (10), repeat breeding (6), wounds (4) and eye affections (2). All the animals were vaccinated against Foot and Mouth Disease.

Dr SK Das, Principal Scientist and Mr D Bhaskara Rao, Technical Officer of the Centre, Dr RS Ranade, Associate Dean along with a team of faculty and students from the College of Veterinary Sciences, Shirwal have participated in the health camp along with two Veterinary Officers of State Animal Husbandry Department. Dr A Ulemale, Associate Professor, Department of Surgery and Radiology, KNP College of Veterinary Sciences, Shirwal, coordinated the programme.
