

**TEC, ICAR – Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Pune, organised an Animal Health Camp on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2017 at *Satalwadi* village of Pune District**

An animal Health Camp was organised in collaboration with KNP College of Veterinary Science (MAFSU), Shirwal, Satara (MH) and State Animal Husbandry Department, Govt of Maharashtra on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2017 at Satalwadi village, Purandar Taluka of Pune District. Dr SK Das and Dr HP Aithal, Principal Scientists of TEC IVRI, seven faculty members and several PG students of KNP College of Veterinary Science, Shirwal, and local Livestock Development Officer and his team from Veterinary Hospital, Shirwal have participated in the programme.

During the camp, 221 livestock consisting of cattle, buffaloes, goats, sheep and dog of 64 farmers were treated. Most common conditions were endo- and ecto- parasitic infection, debility, anoestrus, repeat breeding, pregnancy diagnosis, anorexia, eye infection and otitis etc. Besides treatment, the animals were also vaccinated against FMD. During the programme, a live demonstration of enrichment of dry roughage by urea molasses treatment was also given to the farmers.
